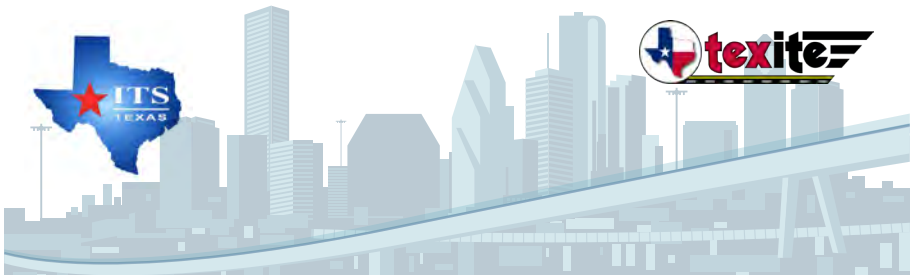

The initial version of the TxDOT Statewide TSMO Strategic Plan was issued in August of 2017. The purpose of the Statewide TSMO Strategic Plan is to provide a framework for TSMO planning throughout the state. In the fall of 2018 TxDOT executed four professional engineering consultant services contracts to provide assistance with the tasks associated with developing district and regional level TSMO plans, and with further mainstreaming TSMO at the division level. 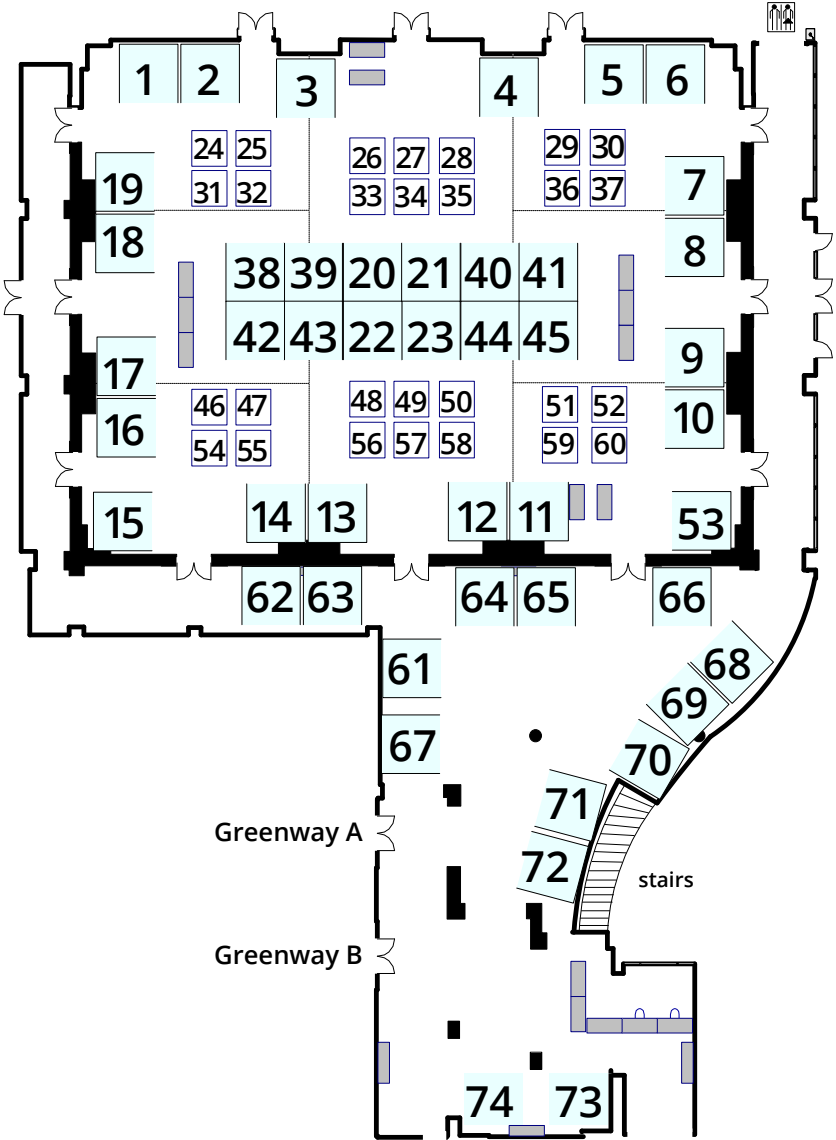

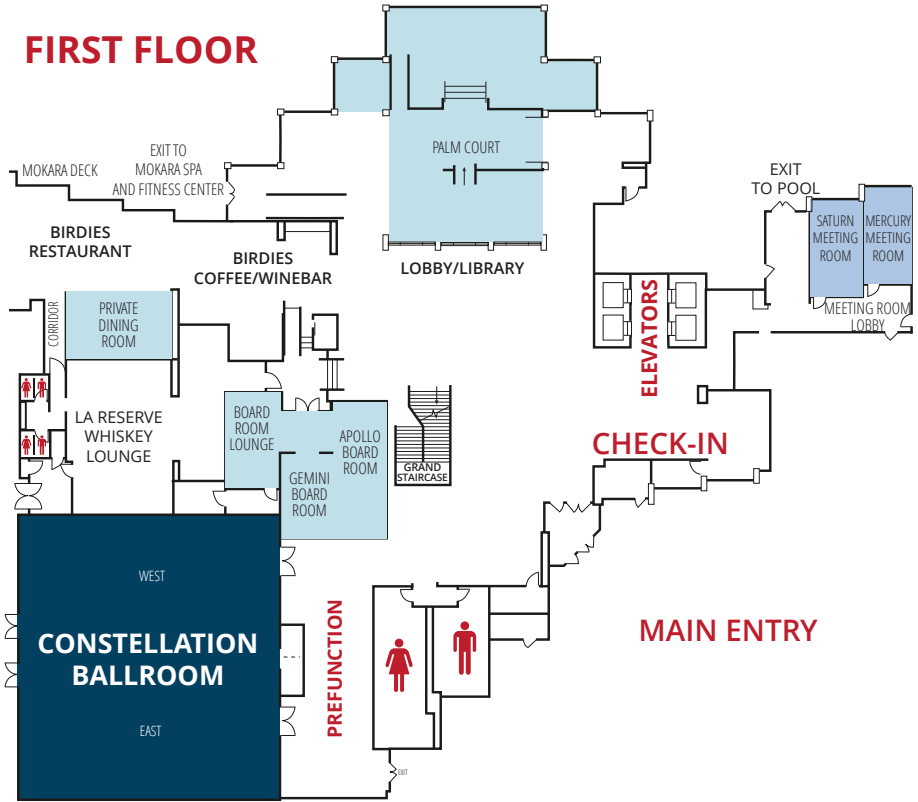

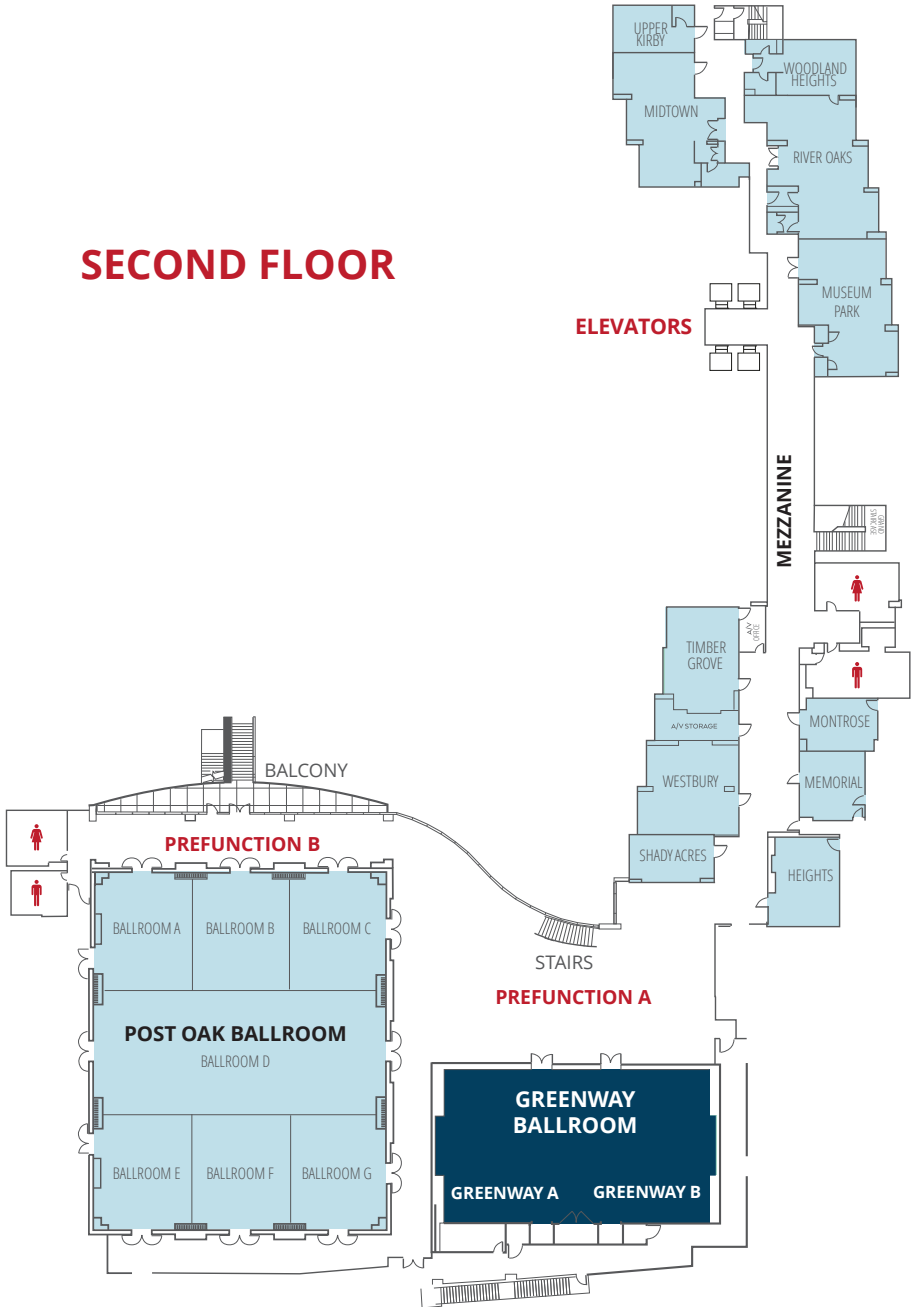
