


THE LITTLE GAMES



Peterbilt Plant Tour

Visit the Peterbilt Denton Plant and get a glimpse of the company's past, present, and future. Since Peterbilt's opening in August 1980, the Denton manufacturing plant has become the main facility for the brand. The tour includes a briefing of Peterbilt's history, Peterbilt Experience area which has interactive displays, a 1939 truck, and other historically significant trucks. This is followed by a guided walk through the assembly plant to observe how Peterbilt trucks are produced from start to finish. The tour itself will last about 1.5 hours. The remainder of the time will include an optional lunch with other tour participants, at your own expense.




