SECTION HISTORY

The South Texas ITE Section (STITE) is a sub-area of District 9 of the Texas District of ITE (a.k.a. TexITE). The section was formed in 1997 and includes 46 counties in the area that stretches from Del Rio to San Antonio to Victoria and south to the Rio Grande Valley (more land than some states!). STITE boundaries include McAllen, Laredo, Corpus Christi, South Padre Island, Kingsville, Harlingen and Brownsville. There have been few opportunities in South Texas for people in the transportation industry to network with their peers, enhance technical skills or learn new methods of controlling and planning for traffic.

FINANCES

The current STITE bank account balance is \$7,315. The 2012 fiscal year began with a balance of \$6,818. While maintaining a healthy bank balance, the Section has focused more on providing greater value to our members such as hosting webinars and evening socials.

Building a Better Ride, Creating a Better Community



January 25 meetings was held at the Liberty Bar and was attended by 44 STITE members. STITE President **Mike Garza** and STITE Vice President **Amy Lewis** welcomed everyone to the meeting and summarized the Officer's goals for the section this year which include expanding the scholarship and obtaining nonprofit status. Mike Garza then introduced the speaker, **Brian Buchanan** from VIA Metropolitan Transit.

Mr. Buchanan gave a presentation on VIA's transit plans. He gave an overview of VIA's Comprehensive Plan, which strives to relieve congestion, promote transit-oriented development, and encourage pedestrian and bicycle use. The plan also calls for a 51 percent increase in bus ridership and a 10 percent reduction in bus travel times.

Mr. Buchanan also gave an overview of the conceptual plan which includes streetcar, light rail, and bus rapid transit. The first bus rapid transit route is scheduled for 2015 and will run from the Westside Multimodal Transit

Transit Center to the Medical Center Transit Center. The first streetcar lines are scheduled for the downtown area in 2020. The streetcar is expected to increase density in the downtown area, increase property values, and reduce congestion.

The downtown transit lines will be served by the Westside Multimodal Transit Center and the Robert Thompson Transit Center. Mr. Buchanan showed a concept for a Westside Transit Village stretching along Houston Street to the Westside Multimodal Transit Center. The transit village would create a corridor emphasizing transit and pedestrians while revitalizing the west side of downtown.



South Texas Section Wins TexITE Activities Award!

The South Texas Section is the winner of the TexITE Section Activities Award. The award was announced at the San Marcos TexITE meeting in March, and the South Texas Section was awarded a \$1,000 prize. The award also makes STITE eligible for the ITE Section Activities Award.

US 281
Superstreet:
The After Study



The February 29 lunch meeting was held at the Liberty Bar. STITE President Mike Garza and Vice President Amy Lewis welcomed the 44 attendees and gave an update on STITE news. Christina De La Cruz was announced as the new Scholarship Committee chair, and Rene Arredondo was announced as the new Member Services Committee Chair. The Member Services Committee is tasked with identifying additional training and educational opportunities for STITE members. Mike Garza announced Patrick Irwin from the Alamo Regional Mobility Authority (RMA) as the meeting's featured Speaker.

Mr. Irwin presented the results of the US 281 After Study. Mr. began his presentation by giving an overview of superstreets and the US 281 project. A superstreet is a road where the through and left-turn movements are prohibited from the side street. These movements must turn right and complete their movement indirectly by using a signalized turnaround. This configuration simplifies the traffic signal operation and allows for more green time to be given to each movement. The US 281 Superstreet was the first in Texas, but several have been implemented in North Carolina and Michigan

The US 281 superstreet was designed to relieve congestion along US 281 north of Loop 1604 until a grade-separated roadway could

be constructed. Superstreet intersections were constructed on US 281 at Encino Rio, Evans, Stone Oak, and Marshall. Prior to the construction of the superstreet, a traffic study conducted by Pape-Dawson Engineers for the RMA predicted an approximately 3 minute reduction in southbound travel times through the superstreet corridor during the morning peak hour and a 7 minute reduction in northbound travel times in the afternoon peak hour.

The RMA conducted travel time studies along US 281 before and after the superstreet was implemented. The field travel times closely matched the predicted reductions in travel times. The morning peak hour travel times were reduced by more than four minutes, and the afternoon travel times were reduced by more than six minutes. Additionally, traffic counts taken on US 281 show that traffic volumes on US 281 south of Evans Road increased by more than ten percent after the superstreet was implemented.

Mr. Irwin also gave an update on the US 281 and Loop 1604 interchange, which is currently under construction, as well as future RMA projects. The future projects include improvements to several segments of Loop 1604 as well as a grade-separated roadway on US 281 north of Loop 1604.

1st Annual STEM Fundraiser

The First Annual STEM Fundraiser (E-STAR) was held Saturday March 31. The softball and volleyball tournament, which was co-hosted by STITE, ASCE, and SHPE raised money for the three organization's scholarship programs. The first annual event was a great success, resulting in \$3,500 being raised for the scholarships, which will be split evenly between the organizations. Thank you to all of our sponsors, as well as everyone who volunteered and participated. We hope to see everyone at next year's event!

San Antonio Bikes





The May 30 meeting was held at the Liberty Bar in San Antonio. Vice President **Amy Lewis** opened the meeting. Secretary/Treasurer **Derek Mueller** gave an overview of the current STITE finances. Amy Lewis then introduced speaker **Julia Diana**.

Ms. Diana gave an overview of San Antonio's bike programs. She stressed the needs of the "6 Es" to ensure the program's success. The 6 Es include Engineering, Education, Encouragement, Enforcement, Evaluation, Equity.

One of San Antonio's most prominent bike programs is the B-Cylcle program. B-Cycle is a bike sharing program in the downtown area. The program currently has 230 bikes located at 23 stations. Ms. Diana said the B-Cycle bikes are easy to ride and can be adjusted for almost any height. Membership is \$60 a week, \$24 a day, or \$10 a day. Bike share stations will also be located on the Mission Reach of the River Walk.

Since its launch in March of 2011, over 32,000 trips and 120,000 miles have been logged on the B-Cycle bikes which Ms. Diana said has burned more than 5.4 million calories.

Ms. Diana then talked about the engineering involved to expand the bicycle network. This consists of new wayfinding signs, and sharrow pavement markings. Sharrow markings are

placed in the lane to alert drivers to bikes in the road and give guidance on where bikes should travel within the lane.

Ms. Diana then gave an overview of the Bicycle Master Plan. In 2010, there were more than 210 mile of bike facilities in San Antonio. To expand the existing bike network, the bike plan recommends a variety of facilities for different roads. The facilities range from buffered bike lanes or cycle tracks, to simpler treatments such as signed bike routes or sharrow markings. The Bike Plan recommends 1,768 miles of bike facilities in San Antonio which includes 861 mile of bike lanes.

The programs to promote bicycle use have paid off in San Antonio. Ms. Diana announced that the June 2012 edition of *Bicycling* Magazine listed San Antonio as the 47th best cycling city.

The City also has various other bicycle education and awareness programs such as Siclovia, which encourages people to walk and bike on a portion of Broadway which is closed to traffic. Additionally, the City is trying to educate the public about new ordinances which require bikes to have lights and for vehicles to give at least three feet of buffer space when passing bikes.

> Downtown Transportation Study



The South Texas ITE May lunch meeting was held at the Liberty Bar on June 27. Vice-President **Amy Lewis** opened the meeting and gave an overview of Section Activities for the remainder of the year. Secretary/Treasurer **Derek Mueller** gave an update of Section finances. Amy Lewis introduced speaker **Kerri Collins** to talk about the Downtown Transportation Study.

Kerri Collins gave an overview of the Downtown Transportation Study, which was prepared for the City by a team led by Pape-Dawson Engineers. The Study required coordination with a variety of stakeholders, and three public meetings were also held.

A significant amount of data needed to be collected to analyze the downtown street network. Ms. Collins said 73 24-hour counts and 134 turning movement counts were collected.

A key element of the Study was to identify projects for the \$40 million set aside in the 2012 Bond Program. Ms. Collins gave descriptions of the improvement concepts for each of the five projects.

The Commerce Street improvements consist of removing the bus-only lane to accommodate wider sidewalks and streetscaping improvements. The Market Street realignment will have Market Street run parallel to Commerce near Interstate 35

which will allow the expansion of the Convention Center and provide connections to the east side. The improvements for Frio Street change the lane widths to provide a wider outside lane for bikes and also widen the sidewalks. Main and Soledad are both one-way streets, and the improvements consist of removing travel lanes to provide wider sidewalks, reverse angle parking, and streetscaping elements. The San Pedro, Main, and Navarro intersection is a heavily channelized five-legged intersection with a bus contraflow lane. Pape-Dawson developed four improvement concepts which reduce driver confusion and also create large pedestrian areas. In addition to the Bond projects, additional Downtown Street improvements were also developed and analyzed for the Study.

The Study also identified street types for the Downtown Streets based on the character of the existing and future land uses in the area. The street types emphasize specific design elements which enhance the character and function of the street. Additional overlays were developed for unique streets such as those with transit routes, within historic districts, or on bike routes. These street types can be used to give guidance for future projects not specifically identified in the Study.

held on September 21 in Corpus Christi, TX at the TxDOT District offices. The Conference began with a catered lunch for the attendees. As lunch wound down, STITE President Mike **Garza** welcomed everyone to the Conference and Vice President Amy Lewis introduced the speakers. The first three speakers all gave presentations related to the transportation issues resulting from the Eagle Ford Shale drilling.

The first speaker, Thomas Tunstall, Ph.D gave a presentation on the Impact of Eagle Ford Shale on South Texas. Dr. Tunstall is the Director of the Center for Community and Business Research at UTSA and recently conducted an economic study on the Eagle Ford Shale. He discussed the rapid increase in activity in the Eagle Ford Region, which has produced almost \$20 billion in total economic output. He also gave projections for future development in the area. With all the economic development in the area, Mr. Tunstall stressed the importance of improving the infrastructure in the area to support the growth including schools, housing options, and roadways.

The next presentation was given by Jeff LaBenz Hough, of HDR. Mr. LaBenz serves on the Eagle Ford Shale Consortium Board. He reiterated the tremendous growth the area has seen and showed examples of the strain this development is placing on the existing infrastructure. 1,200 trucks are required at a well site to get it operational, which results in a dramatic increase in traffic on what are typically rural roads. He showed examples of where problems have occurred do to insufficient infrastructure.

The next speaker, Danny Magee, Director of Transportation for the TxDOT Laredo District,

STITE's Third Annual Regional Conference was gave a presentation on the impacts of the Eagle Ford Shale from TxDOT's perspective. Mr. Magee said that the truck traffic each well produces is the equivalent of approximately 8 million passenger cars, which creates considerable wear on the roads. Mr. Magee said one of the largest problems TxDOT is facing is developing agreements for the private drilling companies to pay TxDOT for the roadway improvements that both parties want.

> After Mr. Magee's presentation, all three presenters participated in a question and answer session. Before the next two presenters, there was a break for the vendor session.

The next speaker, Ernesto De La Garza gave a presentation on Cost Effective Pavement Design Methods for the US 77 Design/Build Project. He detailed issues associated the design process in design/build projects and how they worked to develop an economical yet robust pavement section.

The final presentation was given by **Bobby** Ballí on ethics. Mr. Ballí is a member of the Texas Board of Professional Engineers. In his entertaining presentation, Mr. Ballí presented some ethics case studies and discussed ethics in engineering. He also discussed some items the Board will be considering and their implications.

After the Conference adjourned, man of the attendees enjoyed a seafood dinner at Snoopy's on the Pier. The next morning, STITE held its Third Annual Fishing Contest.
