Affecting the Roadway and the Driver

- Traffic Engineering
 - Roadway design and operation
 - Influencing the Individual Driver
 - Signs, Signals and Markings
 - At a specific point along the road
 - What if? It's not a localized problem?
 - Like...





An epidemic of teen crash fatalities

12 over 3 years

 - A speed hump on every block?

First Step towards understanding — Crash Analysis

- Accumulate, synthesize and analyze crash data
- Identify
 - Causes
 - Locations
 - Countermeasures







TxDOT Safety Bonds

- 2003 Legislature \$6 Billion 20% to safety
- TTI helped identify 600 Locations
 - Widening narrow rural highways
 - Median Barriers
 - Left Turn Lanes
 - Grade Separations
- TxDOT built the improvements





TxDOT Safety Bonds

- Widening results released
- 1,159 miles of narrow, 2-lane roadways
- Crash reductions
 - 44 lives annually
 - 298 injuries
- Analysis of others continues





Data-Driven Safety Improvements

- Real returns on investments
- Systematic vs. Reactive approach
- Local, Regional, State levels
- Nominal vs. Substantive
 - Design "Standards"
 - Highway Safety Manual
 - CSS

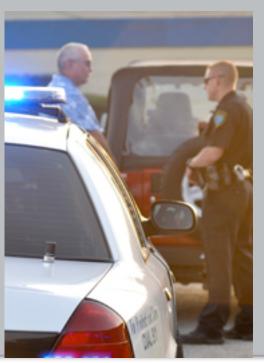

Distracted driving

- Rapidly growing problem
 - Distraction causes 1 in 4 crashes in Texas
 - 1,259 DWI deaths; 408 distraction deaths
- Persistent public policy issue











Distracted driving studies

- Teen Passenger Simulator Study
- In-Vehicle DVD Players
- Driver Perceptions of Risks of Distraction
- Distraction due to in-vehicle information and warning systems
- Effects of texting





Distracted driving studies

Reaction time light Eye glance position and Hand position Left side view Right side view



Experiment





In-Vehicle Texting Study

- Reaction times ~ 2X slower
- Missed response events
- Speed variation **↑**
- Lane position variation
- Overall speed
- ullet Forward glances ullet
- Reading vs. writing difference **NONE**
 - Exception: Response to light
- Next: Study Voice to Text effects





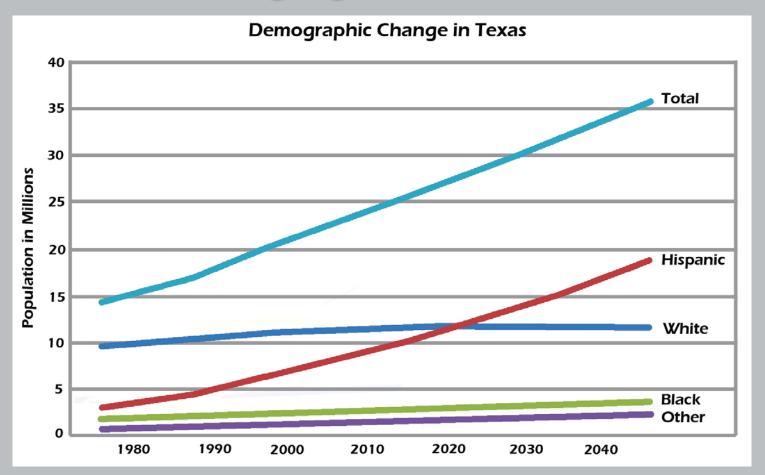
Impaired driving

- Evaluate and improve processes
 - Administrative license revocation
 - No-refusal initiatives
 - Evidence-based countermeasures
- Examine effects of alcohol on driving task
 - Raise public awareness
 - Help change the driving culture
 - Support other safety efforts

Latino traffic safety

- Fast-growing population segment
- 2010: 9.1 million -- 2030: 15.1 million
- High-risk group
 - Less likely to have driver license
 - Less likely to wear motorcycle helmet
 - More likely to drive impaired
 - Children less likely to be restrained
 - Children 72% more likely to die in crash





Military traffic safety

- After 9-11: more soldiers killed in traffic crashes than in combat
- Under-25 soldiers over-represented:
 61 % of all vehicle crash deaths
- 24% of all crash deaths on motorcycles
- CTS initiative involves former and current military personnel
