











# **V2I Demonstration** by Traffic

At your appointed time, meet your guide at the registration desk.

This demonstration showcases Vehicle-to-Infrastructure (V2I) technology that has been in development for almost a decade and is the first to market of its kind. This technology first went live in Las Vegas in December 2016 and is **Technology Services** now coming to Frisco. The City of Frisco streams real-time signal system and intersection data to Traffic Technology Services, Inc. (TTS) who processes the data, predicts the upcoming traffic signal state change, and streams this information to Audi of America. Audi of America then delivers the information to their vehicles using cellular communications.

> This demonstration will showcase an Audi connected vehicle application communicating with Frisco's traffic signal infrastructure and demonstrate how the technology can improve the way a motorist operates a vehicle and enhance their driving experience. Test drivers will experience Time-To-Green, which is the first of seven applications that will be available. The applications are used by Audi of America for its Traffic Light Information service which became available in its 2017 models. More information on the system is available from Audi of America's news release and video.


